

PRIGO Means of combining the International Baccalaureate (IB) and the Czech school leaving examination (CZ)

IB in full CZ in full	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • complete and closed secondary education in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at universities in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at foreign universities • no nostrification required
IB in full CZ in part	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • need for nostrification (a Czech school-leaving certificate will be issued) • complete and closed secondary education in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at universities in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at foreign universities
IB in full (with the subjects CZ and L at High Level) No CZ	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • need for nostrification (a Czech school-leaving certificate will be issued) • complete and closed secondary education in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at universities in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at foreign universities
IB in full (without the subjects CZ and L at High Level) No CZ	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • secondary education in the Czech Republic not formally closed • until graduation from university, only primary education completed • fully accepted at foreign universities • accepted at some universities in the Czech Republic according to the Higher Education Act
IB Certificate (only selected subjects from IB) CZ in full	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • complete and closed secondary education in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at universities in the Czech Republic • accepted at foreign universities with certain reservations • selected subjects (from which the student holds the IB certificate) represent an advantage for admission in the given field of study
No IB CZ in full	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • complete and closed secondary education in the Czech Republic • fully accepted at universities in the Czech Republic • accepted at foreign universities with certain reservations

Note: The IB takes place in the next-to-last year of secondary school (in May) while the CZ school leaving examination takes place in the last year of secondary school (in May).
